Forma	Uso	Esempi
TIPO 0		
<b>If+soggetto+simple present (if clause), +soggetto+simple present/imperativo/modale (main clause)</b>	Riferito ad abitudini, istruzioni, processi scientifici o meccanici	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- It splits in two, if you put too much force on it.</li> <li>-Press the red button if you want to stop the engine.</li> <li>-Don't forget to pick her up, if you want her to come.</li> </ul>
TIPO 1 (della realtà)		
<b>If+soggetto+present simple (if clause), + soggetto+ will+base form (main clause)</b>	Riferito ad eventi futuri possibili o probabili	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-If I'm fine, I'll come to your party</li> <li>- I'll go skiing next week-end if it snows during the week.</li> <li>- If the weather is bad, the concert will be postponed.</li> </ul>
TIPO 2 (della probabilità)		
<b>If+soggetto+simple past (if clause), + soggetto+ would/could/might+base form (main clause)</b>	Riferito ad eventi che è improbabile che accadano	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-If I had more time, I'd like to learn how to play the guitar.</li> <li>- My team might win the tournament, If it had another coach.</li> <li>- If my students were quieter, I could give them more interesting things to do.</li> <li>-*Imagine you won the lottery. What would you do with all that money?</li> </ul>

TIPO 3		
<b>If+oggetto+past perfect (if clause), +oggetto+would have/could have/might have+past participle del verbo (main clause)</b>	Riferito ad ipotesi impossibili su fatti già accaduti	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>-I would have come to the match, if my wife hadn't broken her leg.</li><li>- I could have been a diver, If my parents had helped me to overcome my fear of water.</li><li>-If we had had more time, we would have visited not only Rome but Venice as well.</li></ul>
